#### Important dates to remember:


ELA (English Language Arts) state test for grades 3 and 4 are April 10 and 11.

As we start the second semester, staying involved in your child's academic progress is crucial, and the use of tools like ProgressBook can greatly assist parents in keeping track of their child's performance. Please take advantage of this great resource.

If your son/daughter is a sophomore or junior and is interested in Apollo, it is important they speak with Mr. Baumgartner and register online as Several programs at Apollo fill up quickly. I know spring seems a long way off with the cold temperatures but it will be here before we know it. During the late winter/early spring, we will have the ACT and state testing. On some of the days, we will be running on an adjusted schedule. The testing dates will be as follows:

ACT for juniors will be February 27th - all juniors will be excused from their afternoon

classes following testing  $3^{rd} - 4^{th}$  grade ELA will be April  $10^{th}$  and  $11^{th}$   $5^{th} - 8^{th}$  grade ELA and High School English II will be April  $16^{th}$  and  $17^{th}$   $3^{rd} - 4^{th}$  grade Math will be April  $23^{rd}$  and  $24^{th}$   $5^{th} - 8^{th}$  grade Math and High School Algebra I and Geometry will be April  $25^{th}$  and  $26^{th}$   $5^{th}$  &  $8^{th}$  grade Science and High School Biology, American History, and Government will be May 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>

We recognize that our students work very hard and do not want these tests to cause anxiety. We would like you to discuss the importance of the tests with your child, as they are important to our district. They allow us to analyze the effectiveness of our academic programs and make needed changes to ensure our students are getting the best education possible. For the high school classes, this is a requirement for graduation. You can help alleviate any stress your child may feel by making sure he or she gets adequate sleep the night before and proper nutrition the morning of his or her test.

I know the seniors are counting down the days until graduation. While it seems like a long way off, it will be here before we know it. Graduation will be held Sunday, May 26<sup>th</sup> at 2pm in the competition gym. Just a reminder, school, athletic, and Apollo fees will need to be taken care of by May 1st.

# TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE NEWS

Monday, April 8, 2024 will be an exciting day as the first total solar eclipse to be visible in Ohio since 1806 will occur. The next projected total eclipse will not happen in Ohio again until 2099. This unique event is expected to bring thousands of people to our school district and the surrounding area. In fact, Lima, Ohio was selected by Astronomy.com as one of the best 20 places in North America to view the eclipse. The article may be accessed here.

In preparation, Spencerville Local Schools will be closed on April 8, 2024. Spencerville Schools are excited to share this experience with our students and will be providing educational opportunities the week prior to the eclipse. #### Total Solar Eclipse Facts from NASA

- After the total solar eclipse on April 8, 2024, the next total solar eclipse that can be seen from the contiguous United States will be on Aug. 23, 2044.
- We can't normally see the corona the Sun's outer atmosphere because the Sun's surface below it is so much brighter. But during a total solar eclipse, the corona becomes visible, offering unique opportunities to study it.
- When the Moon completely blocks the visible surface of the Sun during a total solar eclipse, viewers can remove their eclipse glasses. A total solar eclipse is the only type of solar eclipse where eclipse glasses





#### School Transportation Update - Bus GPS is on the way!

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we continue to navigate the challenges of school transportation. In my short time as transportation supervisor, I have discovered that there is a lot involved in the daily task of getting 700+ students to and from school and extracurricular events on time, especially in less-than-ideal weather.

Spencerville Schools are working to install GPS devices on all buses for the start of the 2024-25 school year. GPS units on our buses will benefit our transportation department personnel, bus drivers, and our Bearcat families. "BusRight" GPS systems will allow us to use advanced routing software, will provide turn-by-turn directions for bus drivers, and will allow for students and parents to get real-time updates on the location of their bus. We are looking forward to this new technology creating a more efficient and effective transportation system.

On a related note, this is a great time to give a shout-out to our bus drivers. These individuals have a difficult job, but they do a wonderful job of safely transporting our students!
