VIII. Apollo Update - Penny Kill

SB 3 (the RESA amendment) sponsored by Senators Faber and Hite will be coming before the House for a vote next. This is important for Spencerville because the new teacher licensure program currently in law and in ODE regulations affects ALL new teachers because it has in place a 4 year residency program in which ODE contracted with Teachscape (a company in California) to design a "performance assessment" given to all new teachers in year 3. This assessment is a 15 minute video judged by an anonymous assessor who gets to say yes or no to your new teacher continuing in the teaching profession and being issued a 5 year license after they pass. The stats are dismal in the first two years of the summative assessment and worse there has been no feedback for new teachers to improve or help pass this video process.

SB 3 will give back local control to Boards of Education to either adopt an ALTERNATIVE to year 3 (summative assessment/RESA) or continue with the program currently inplace at ODE. We are of course in favor of anything that gives back local control to school boards.

The Spencerville Local School District Board of Education is a member of the Southwestern Ohio Educational Purchasing Council (EPC). Pursuant to that membership, the Board purchased diary products from Reiter Dairy, LLC, in accordance with certain Purchase and Sales Contracts negotiated with Reiter Dairy by the EPC. Disputes arose between Reiter Dairy, the EPC, and EPC members who purchased dairy products from Reiter Dairy. The Board hereby resolves to compromise and settle its dispute with Reiter Dairy, releasing all claims against Reiter Dairy in exchange for payment of \$1099.34. This sum less a 3% administrative/legal fee retained by the EPC will be paid to the Board consistent with the terms of the Settlement Agreement and Mutual Release of Claims (Agreement), which is appended to this resolution. The Board further resolves that its authorized representative, Dennis Fuge, Superintendent, is instructed to execute the Agreement
