and to purchase a combined insurance policy including all school property, boiler and machinery, general liability, automobile liability, professional liability, excess liability, crime/dishonesty and pollution liability from Southwestern Ohio EPC Liability, Fleet & Property Program (EPC LFP) with quoted limits and deductibles (see proposal) effective July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019 for a total cost of \$42,244.00. Purchase of these policies provides insurance coverage to the board, employees, volunteers, and supporting school district groups including the PTO, Band Boosters, Athletic Boosters, Young Farmers, SHS Alumni, Spencerville FFA Alumni and the Spencerville High School Post Prom Committee.
