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VIII. Apollo Update - Penny Kill

This week we got occupancy on our last 6 classes to move in to their new rooms (CBI, special ed classes and our last social studies class).

The director's office/personnel and our district offices/new board room will be open after Thanksgiving.

The high school welding lab is way ahead of schedule and the students will be moved in over Christmas break.

Robotics equipment purchases for the new robotics lab will be approved by the board at the November meeting and equipment should be installed in December.

We are going to offer the first robotics class at the high school level second semester this year for any current students in welding and machining so they can earn a credential in Fanuc controls along with the other credentials such as AWS certifications in welding even before the students graduate this year. Probably this will be offered to only seniors second semester.

Apollo's guidance staff will be talking to our guidance people on having a new one year robotics/advanced manufacturing program started up for fall 2016.

We are also offering two classes to adult learners in Fanuc (advanced manufacturing) certifications in January 2016 in the evenings. We are currently beginning work with UNOH since they have recently opened their 2-year associates program in Robotics/advanced manufacturing. Apollo students (both high school and adult) will be able to get college credit here at Apollo for the course work and move right on in to their associates degree program and save some tuition dollars in the process. We are shooting for approval of that pathway by next school year 2016-2017.

We have our 40th anniversary/grand opening evening event scheduled for Thursday, September 29, 2016. We are still in the planning stages but have locked in that date and will plan activities and invitations for the community to come and tour the new campus.

Bearcat Strength and Training Center Update - Lori Ringwald

Unfortunately, activity has been slow since last month. We have been waiting almost 3 weeks to get the drawings approved by the state so that the power can be turned on. Once the power is on, electrical circuits can be checked, and then the lifts can be removed from the building allowing the flooring to be started. Plumbing has passed inspection. HVAC completion has been slower than anticipated, but hopefully wrapping up soon. The remaining interior doors will soon be installed. Dirt was hauled in and river rock and landscape fabric barrier was purchased to landscape the exterior of the building at a later date to allow settling of the dirt. For now, the river rock will be stored safely in the bus garage. Everything is looking great, just moving a bit slower than we had hoped. Thank you for your patience; once it is done, I think we will all be very proud.
