<u>Meyer</u> moved and <u>Ringwald</u> seconded the motion to approve the following policy to be placed in the Spencerville Local School District Board of Education Policy Manual.

Professional/Support Staff Fringe Benefits (Variable hour employees) or Part-time and Substitute Professional/Support Staff Employees (Health care coverage)

Based on an appropriate staffing and financial analysis, the Superintendent and Treasurer will determine whether an offer of coverage is appropriate. The Superintendent and Treasurer have the discretion to determine whether an offer of coverage will be made. If there is any uncertainty regarding whether an offer of coverage will be made, the district should contact the Superintendent or Treasurer. If an offering of coverage is appropriate, the following policy will be utilized to determine eligibility for variable hour employees.

Variable Hour Employees (VHE) will not be offered health and prescription drug coverage if, based on the facts and circumstances a the time of hire, the VHE will likely average less than 30 hours per week. The Spencerville Local School District will document why it has been determined that an individual qualifies as a VHE and will count hours in accordance with the following procedures to determine eligibility.

1. <u>Look Back Period:</u> Hours will initially be counted for new VHE based on their date of hire. In addition, hours will also be counted during the District's first standard measurement period from November 1 through October 31 that overlaps with the VHE's initial measurement period to determine the average number of hours worked.

For newly hired VHEs, the Look Back Period will begin on their first day actively working in the District and continue for 12 consecutive months from the date of hire; a 30-day Administrative Period will be used; followed by a 12-month Stability Period for qualified VHEs starting on the first day of their 13th month of hire. Payment of premiums will be handled in the same manner as on-going VHEs.

- 2. If the VHE averages 30 hour or more per week, the Superintendent and Treasurer will determine if an offer of coverage is appropriate.
- 3. <u>Administrative period</u>: November 1 through December 31 will be used to determine the VHEs who met the requirement, offer coverage and enroll them in the District's plan.
- 4. <u>Stability Period:</u> January 1 through December 31 will be the timeframe those VHE who worked an average of 30-hours or more per week will be covered by the District plan if they choose to enroll.
- 5. Payment of Premiums: VHEs who qualify and enroll in the District plan are required to pay the amount established in the negotiated agreement of the single premium to enroll in single coverage and the amount established in the negotiated contract to enroll in family coverage. Payment will be taken on a pre-tax basis through salary reduction as long as the monthly salary covers the cost of the plan selected. If the monthly salary does not cover the amount of the monthly employee contribution, a letter will be included with the paycheck explaining that payment is due within 15 days. If payment is not received by 15 days, the VHE will be terminated from the district plan and offered COBRA coverage. Active coverage will not be available until the next Stability Period assuming the VHE qualified during the associated Look Back Period.
