- 3. The cost of providing transportation in terms of equipment, maintenance, personnel, and administration
- 4. Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation
- 5. Whether and to what extent the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules
- 6. Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available; and

WHEREAS the option of offering payment-in-lieu of transportation is provided in Ohio Revised Code: THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Spencerville Local School District Board of Education hereby approves the declaration that it is impractical to transport the students identified here in and offers the parent(s)/guardians(s) of students named on the attachment, payment-in-lieu of transportation.
