- FFA Banquet was held March 25th highlights include:
 - Supervised Agricultural Experiences Facts and Figures: Our FFA members have over 165 different SAE projects. They have worked over 13,590 hours on their SAE projects during the past year. They have brought in over \$84,611 from their paychecks, livestock sales, crop sales, and other income sources from our projects in the past year. With their SAE projects, we have spent over \$10,033 at local businesses for our projects ranging from seed, fertilizer, animals, rent and other types of expenses. They have volunteered over 256 hours in 70 different community service activities outside of our SAE projects and FFA activities. With these projects, we will be honoring 10 FFA members that have excellent project records for Chapter Proficiency Awards. Specifically, we will recognize Ryan Kaverman for earning a \$1000 SAE grant from Bob Evan's for which he was in a nationally promoted 30-second social media ad for the restaurant.

- **FFA Officers:** Secretary (Emma Schuller), Treasurer (Emma Core) and Reporter (Kayley Kimmet) all received a Gold Rating from the state on their respective Officer Books.
- **State and American Degrees:** This year FFA members Cade Elling and Heath Gaskill and graduated FFA member Abigail Schwartz will be receiving their State FFA Degrees during a Virtual State FFA Convention. Graduated FFA members McKenna Jones and Matt Macklin are in the last process of achieving their American FFA Degree, which they will receive at a hopeful in-person National FFA Convention in October.
- **POA:** While a different year, our FFA chapter conducted several modified activities throughout the school and in the community. These activities included: helping elementary parents pull off the "Overnight Pumpkin Patch" in October, worked with the Chamber of Commerce to decorate two different businesses windows during December, built the new raised vegetable gardens that will be utilized this spring and summer, conducted typical fruit and strawberries sales, and other activities still being planned for the remainder of the school year. These activities allowed the FFA chapter to apply for National Chapter Award.
- **Contests:** While different in how kids prepared, practiced and competing, our FFA chapter was still able to compete in over 10 different contest and this year hosted the District 4 Job Interview contest. While there are still about 5 contest that our students will still compete in between now and the end of the year, a few highlights for our local students/teams include:
 - District 4 (which is about 10 counties) Placings- 1st Place Team in Food Science, 4th Place Team in Ag Sales, 4th Place in Parliamentary Procedure, 2nd Place Senior Job Interview (Dominic Adkins).
 - State Placings: 13th Place Team for Food Science, 12th Place Team for Landscape, 19th Place Team for Greenhand Contest.
- <u>Recognize Memorial Contributions</u>: Over the past year and half, the FFA has former members, alumni pass away, and we were fortunate enough to have the families donate their memorials to the FFA chapter. With these memorials, our FFA officers and chapter members came up with unique ways to honor these individuals.
 - Jeff Kill Memorial helped to develop our "Spencerville FFA History of Success" boards in the Ag and Art Hallway that recognizes State and American FFA Degrees.
 - Don Graessle's Memorial helped to purchase new FFA officer stations and a gavel set to use during FFA banquets for years to come.
 - Max McMichael's and Jim Warnecke's Memorials were used to construct two podiums for the FFA/school that are connected to the local history of the area. The podiums were constructed with lumber donated from Patrick's General Store that stood from the early 1900's to 1970's in Converse.
- FFA Alumni: We are very thankful that our FFA Alumni has continued to sponsor our chapter through funds and activities for our chapter. This year, operating the junior high concession stands, conducting bi-annuals sub sandwich sales, and its annual pancake and sausage breakfast, our FFA Alumni will be awarding four \$500 scholarships to FFA members and sponsoring \$290 in monetary awards for Chapter Proficiency winners. The FFA Alumni group continues to be a great support of our students by celebrating their success and supporting their activities.
- Honorary Chapter Member: At the banquet, our students recognized Mrs. Brenda Core with the Honorary FFA Degree. This honor is given to one person each year that has helped lead to the success of Spencerville FFA.
- <u>National Chapter Award</u>: For only the 6th time in school history, our FFA chapter earned a rating of National Gold Chapter for Ohio. This goes to the top 10% of chapters in the State of Ohio and allows our chapter to apply for National Three-Star Chapter among other honorees at National Convention in October. The work to earn such honor comes from the elected chapter officers planning, organizing and conducting at least 15 unique chapter lead events in a year that cover a wide variety of areas.

The income subject to the tax is taxable income of individuals and estates as defined in divisions (E)(1)(a) and (2) of Section 5748.01 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 2. That pursuant to such Section 5748.02, this board of education hereby applies to the Tax Commissioner of the Ohio Department of Taxation to estimate the property tax rate that would have to be imposed by the School District in the current year to produce the amount set forth in SECTION 1 hereof and to estimate the income tax rate that would have had to have been in effect for the current year as a school district income tax to produce the amount set forth in SECTION 1 hereof.

SECTION 3. That the treasurer of this board is hereby directed to certify immediately to the Tax Commissioner of the Ohio Department of Taxation a copy of this resolution.

SECTION 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this board of education concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this board of education, and that all deliberations of this board of education, and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the rules of this board of education adopted in accordance therewith.
