IX Apollo Update - by Penny Kill

Per Apollo Supt:

*Congressman Jim Jordan is tentatively scheduled to visit and tour Apollo during the afternoon of October 14. I will let you know when/if details are finalized. We are always happy to host politicians and individuals to show off what we do.

*As I emailed you earlier in the week, we unfortunately had student pass away in a car accident. We utilized our mental health coordinator and the crisis response team sponsored by the Mental Health & Recovery Services Board. I've used this team in the past and find them very valuable in these situations. Rick Skilliter, retired Bluffton police chief, is the leader of this team.

*October is Manufacturing Month in Ohio and we are holding a couple different events to celebrate as we consider ourselves deeply ingrained in the manufacturing world of this region. On Thursday the JSMC (tank plant) brought a tank to Apollo. We have a good relationship with the tank plant and we were very happy that they were willing to bring the tank to Apollo.

*We are purchasing/updating welding equipment that will be used by both high school and adult ed. Students. Some of our current equipment is often not working and generally takes significant time and money to repair. The cost will be approximately \$50,000. We are also updating many of the security cameras and adding a few new ones. We are using funds leftover from the building/renovation project. The estimated cost is \$20,000.

WHEREAS, the student(s) identified below have been determined to be residents of this school district, and eligible for transportation services; and

WHEREAS after a careful evaluation of all available options, it has been determined that it is impractical to provide transportation for these students(s) to their selected school(s); and

WHEREAS the following factors as identified in Revised Code 3327.02 have been considered:

- 1. The time and distance required to provide the transportation
- 2. The number of pupils to be transported
- 3. The cost of providing transportation in terms of equipment, maintenance, personnel, and administration
- 4. Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation
- 5. Whether and to what extent the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules
- 6. Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available; and

WHEREAS the option of offering payment-in-lieu of transportation is provided in Ohio Revised Code:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Spencerville Local School District Board of Education hereby approves the declaration that it is impractical to transport the students identified here in and offers the parent(s)/guardians(s) of students named on the attachment, payment-in-lieu of transportation.
